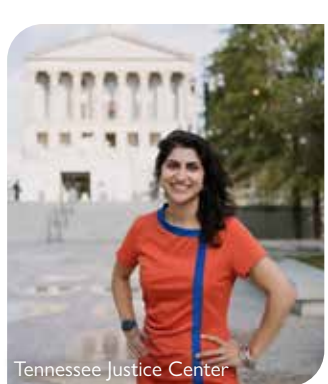
- *Siloam Health* serving Nashville’s uninsured and underinsured, including our immigrant and refugee communities with quality medical care.

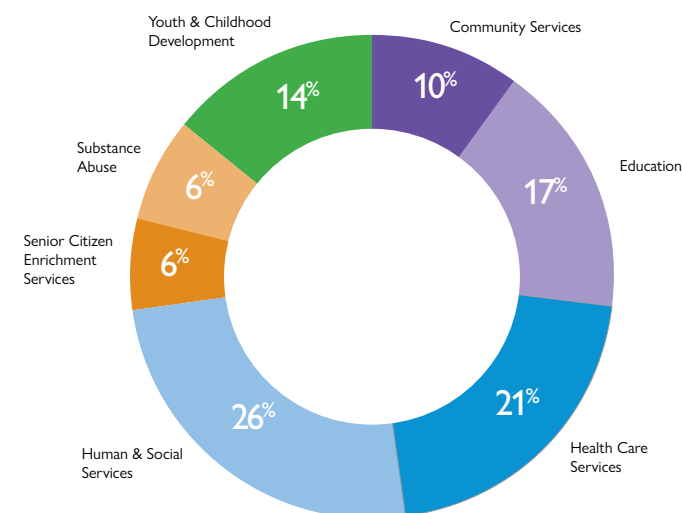
